1. Jesus draws close to those He loves. (Luke 24:36-43)

2. Jesus declares truth to those He loves. (Luke 24:44-46)

Jesu	us directs the lives of those He loves. (Luke 24:48-49)
To	able Talk
1)	How often does Jesus say "peace to you" in the Bible? What does it mean to stand in the presence of Jesus? How would you describe the nature of unbelief? Why were the disciples startled and frightened? What troubles and doubts might have been on their hearts? (v.36-43)
2)	What are several of the prophecies from the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms that were to be fulfilled? What does it mean to have "their minds opened"? Who do you know that needs to hear "that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead"? (v.44-46)
3)	What does it mean to proclaim repentance for the forgiveness of sins? Is there a formula? Does repentance have to be articulated? How do I demonstrate repentance in my life to others? What is the difference between private and corporate repentance? What is the process for someone to repent? What do I do when I see others needing to repent of sin? (v.47)
4)	Where before was this "promise of the Father" talked about? What does it mean that the Holy Spirit will come "upon you"? Did the disciples understand what this meant? Why this charge to stay in the city until they are "clothed with power from on high?" (v.48-49)
